

ASA Research Note Guidelines

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- Every research note must have
 - A descriptive (but not too lengthy) title
 - Your full name
 - Month/Year Written
- Abstract paragraph (3-5 sentences) summarizing the content of the paper.
- Sources/citations styled below, as endnotes

WRITING GUIDELINES

Citations: Sources should be attributed through endnotes. Direct quotes must be enclosed in quotation marks, and content ideas must be attributed through in-text citation and endnotes.

*Please note: Wikipedia (or any other crowd-sourced site) is **NOT** an acceptable citation in an ASA paper. Please track down and use the original source cited in any Wikipedia article.*

Endnote Citation Style

- Last Name, First Name. "Title." Source. Date. Accessed Date <base source website>.

Example:

- Hayes, Emily. "How to Style Your Citations." *ASA Institute for Risk and Innovation*. Apr. 2019. Accessed Apr. 2019 <www.anniesearle.com>.

COPYRIGHT

ASA Research Notes are published first in ASA's monthly newsletter, and then offered on ASA's website. ASA holds the copyright on these research notes posted on the web. Once there are a sufficient number of papers, ASA publishes a volume of the collective work, at which time the copyright reverts to each author after publication of that volume.
